Guest Speaker Nur Haim, 'Canadian Burmese Rohingya Support Organization'

is the guest speaker at St. Michael's Church in Waterloo on **Tuesday, October 17th** at 7:30 p.m., in the Parish Centre (240 Hemlock St. directly across from Wilfrid Laurier University on University Ave. W). The persecution of the Rohingya people in Myanmar is being called a genocide. Nur Hasim, founding member of the local group and himself a Rohingya refugee in Bangladesh for about 15 years before coming to Canada as a government-sponsored refugee 11 years ago, Nur will talk about the history of the conflict between the authorities and the Rohingya and give some insight as to what is happening now both in Myanmar and in the refugee camps in Bangladesh.
