4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel repeats some of last Sunday's. Jesus, at the beginning of his public life, has delivered what today we would call his 'mission statement', using words of the prophet Isaiah. Today, as he speaks, Jesus says that these words are being fulfilled – in him. The Messiah they have been waiting for is now here in the person of Jesus. His Kingdom has begun to be realised in his works of healing, of reconciliation and liberation from evil powers.

At first, the crowd was amazed that one of their fellow villagers could speak with such grace and eloquence and with such authority. But it was something altogether different to put themselves in his hands. Who did he really think he was? After hearing Jesus' words about the poor reception of prophets by their own people, they were worked up into a blind rage and hatred. They wanted to push Jesus off the cliff on which their town was built. But, says Mark, Jesus passed through their midst and left them. These are terrible words and let us pray that such a thing may never happen to us:

– that Jesus should walk right through us

- that we should fail to recognise his presence among us (usually in the people around us)

- that we even reject him,

so that he goes off without us, leaving us behind. It will not be he who has abandoned us; we will have rejected him. And he will never force himself on us.
