## 8<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

In Today's gospel Jesus takes aim at giving good counsel, to lead a good life in God: "Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will both not fall into a pit? No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher." Later on Jesus gives a short test of humility to everyone, asking him to correct first himself, to be able later to criticize the others; or to look at the goodness of someone's heart, by his good acts, as we can recognize a good tree by its good fruits. Because "a good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good, but an evil person out of a store of evil produces evil; for from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks." This is good advice for our good life, which leads us to God, and which gives us our divine teacher Jesus Christ.

#### How the Lenten Season Is Observed

The Lenten season is a time when many Christians observe a period of fasting, repentance, moderation, self-denial and spiritual discipline. The purpose is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ-his suffering and his sacrifice, his life, death, burial, and resurrection.

#### The Significance of 40 Days

The significance of the 40-day period of Lent (Technically 46, as Sundays are not included in the count) is based on two episodes of spiritual testing in the Bible: the 40 years of wilderness wanderings by the Israelites after the exodus from Egypt (Numbers 33:38 and Deuteronomy 1:3) and the Temptation of Jesus after he spent 40 days fasting in the wilderness (Mt 4:1-11; Mk 1:12-13; Luke 4:1-13).

#### The Distribution of Ashes

During Mass, the ashes which give Ash Wednesday its name are distributed. The ashes are made by burning the blessed palms that were distributed the previous year on Palm Sunday. After the priest blesses the ashes the faithful come forward to receive them. The priest dips his right thumb in the ashes and, making the Sign of the Cross on each person's forehead, says, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

#### Ash Wednsaday

The Church emphasizes the penitential nature of Ash Wednesday by calling us to fast and abstain from meat. Catholics who are over the age of 18 and under the age of 60 are required to fast, which means that they can eat only one complete meal and two smaller ones during the day, with no food in between. Catholics who are over the age of 14 are required to refrain from eating any meat on Ash Wednesday.
