25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Gospel this Sunday speaks about stewardship. A steward is a person who is made responsible to handle the goods and property of his employer. The steward in the Gospel today was a bad steward because he was wasteful of his master's property. He was going to be fired so he took steps to guarantee his future employability. And "the master praised the dishonest steward for his astuteness". Jesus obviously told this story not to encourage dishonesty but to draw attention to the foresight of the steward. And so I tell you this: "use money, tainted as it is, to win you friends and thus make sure that when it fails you, they will welcome you into the tents of eternity." Jesus' choice of a "steward" in today's passage is altogether to the point. We need to be constantly reminded that we are the stewards and never the owners of what we possess. We have no absolute right to anything we have. "I can do what I like with my money and property because it's mine" is not a statement any committed Christian can make. So the question of a successful life is not "How much did you make?" but "How did you use what you had to creative purposes for the general welfare of all?" That is the way to make the friends Jesus talks about in the Gospel.
