As Jesus enters a village in today's gospel, he is greeted by ten lepers who come out to meet him. "They stood some way off." As lepers they were compelled to cry out "unclean" and to ring a bell when they saw people approaching. Still some distance from Jesus they called out in desperation: "Jesus! Master! Take pity on us! They had no illusions about their helpless situation. Jesus makes no fuss. He simply tells them to "Go and show yourselves to the priests". On their way to carry out this instruction they discovered that they were cleansed and healed. Clearly this was a reward for their unquestioning and trusting response to Jesus' instructions? A reward for their faith in him. And why did Jesus tell them to go to the priests? Because it was not enough for them to be healed; they would also have to be officially declared clean by the religious authorities. Only then could they be fully integrated back into "normal" society. Yet, after they were cured, it was not the members of God's chosen people who came back to express thanks to their Lord but this outcast... Jesus highlights this fact by his own reaction. "Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they?" Yes, we all need, with the Samaritan, to be cleansed, to be healed, to be made whole of all the toxic substances in our system which distort our relationships and the way we see those around us.

May you use those gifts that you have received and pass on the love that has been given to you.
