In today's Gospel we have the strange scene between a Pharisee and a tax collector. The Pharisee – and he clearly has evidence to prove it – is the "good" person. He faithfully observes the obligations of a good Jew: he prays, he fasts, and he gives alms. And yet, God is not happy with him. Why? Because he is basically a totally self-centred person. What he really is saying is: "God, you should be deeply grateful that you have someone like me (and there are not many of us), someone who is so faithful in following your commands..." God should be so happy to have such a rare example like him. Especially when so many are like the tax collector. Jesus criticizes the Pharisee for not being aware that all these good things he claims to do have God as their source. Without God, he could do nothing, he would be nothing...
