3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

There are three distinct parts in today's Gospel reading:

- Jesus, the light of the nations and the fulfilment of Hebrew Testament prophecies.
- A call to total conversion, to live in that light.
- Early responses to the call.

After the arrest of John the Baptist, Jesus moves up north to Galilee. It is his home province. It is where he will begin his public life. But it is precisely in this Galilean town of Capernaum that Jesus, the Messiah, begins his mission. His preaching is summed up in one deceptively simple sentence: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near." Today's call is asking us not just to fit Jesus into our chosen way of living but to fit ourselves into his vision of life. In doing so, we are not making a sacrifice; we are on to a sure winner where we can only gain.

BIBLE SUNDAY 2020

The inspiration for The Bible Speaks comes from Pope Francis' letter for the conclusion of the Year of Mercy, Misericordia et misera, #7, in which he states, "It would be beneficial if every Christian community, on one Sunday of the liturgical year, could renew its efforts to make the Sacred Scriptures better known and more widely diffused. It would be a Sunday given over entirely to the word of God, so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people." Bishop Crosby and the Diocese of Hamilton has chosen the third Sunday of Ordinary Time each year as our day to emphasize how The Bible Speaks and how We Listen. This year it will be observed on Sunday, January 26th, 2020. Prayer Cards will be distributed at Mass this weekend. Parishioners are invited to offer this prayer at the conclusion of Prayer of the Faithful in thanksgiving for the gift of God's Word. Order forms for Bibles will also be available for parishioners who wish to purchase a Bible. We pray that our observance of Bible Sunday will deepen our gratitude for the Word of God and inspire us to read the Word of God on regular bases. The book: Getting to know the Gospel of Matthew by Scott M. Lewis SJ will be

distributed at Mass this weekend as well.

Begin with a prayer to the Holy Spirit. Read through the passage once at a normal pace. Get a sense of the phrases. Allow the Word to seep more deeply into your heart. Read the passage through, section by section. How does this Word speak to me at this time, in this context? What emotions are evoked by the Word? How does this Word speak to me of God and how does it impact my life? Conclude with a prayer of thanksgiving to the Holy Spirit.
