Fifth Sunday of Easter

Acts 6:1-7; 1 Peter 2:4-9; John 14:1-12

The context of the Gospel, is Jesus' long discourse with his disciples, at the Last Supper. They are aware that Jesus is about to leave them. "Do not let your hearts be troubled," are the encouraging words He speaks to them. "Trust in God still, and trust in me" is a call to total faith in the Father and in Jesus. The disciples cannot be too happy to hear that Jesus is about to leave them. It is no wonder that their hearts are "troubled". This, in spite of the promise, that Jesus is going away, to "prepare a place" for them, that He will return to take them with Him, "so that where I am, you may be too".

Jesus, has now been with them for three years. He has taught them continuously, all during this time, and they have seen Him teaching and working among the people, so "You know the way to the place where I am going," they are told.

Thomas, the man who likes to confront, and the one with the very literal mind, protests: "Lord, we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?" He is clearly thinking in geographical terms. In fact, all of Jesus' words about going and coming, are spoken with quite a different level of meaning. However, we can be grateful to Thomas for drawing out of Jesus, one of the great sayings, in John's Gospel: "I AM the Way — I AM Truth and Life. No one can come to the Father except through me." To follow the Way of Jesus, is not to go anywhere. It is to become a special kind of person, a person whose whole being reflects the Truth and Life that Jesus reveals to us. It is to be a person, who has totally identified with the vision and the values of Jesus. To be such a person, is to be a person of Truth and Life.

Happy Mother's Day





ARE THERE ANY REASONS TO PRAY THE ROSARY DAILY?



Praying the Rosary is a largely Catholic and Eastern Orthodox tradition. It is a series of prayers designed to have the praying soul ponder "the Great Mysteries" of Jesus' life. Of course, it is much more than that to believers in the power of the Rosary. But, for everyday Christians, are there any reasons to pray the Rosary daily? Is this in line with your beliefs? "To recite the Rosary is nothing other than to contemplate the face of Christ with Mary". - Pope John Paul II

The Rosary is a unique form of prayer, held

dearly in the hearts of many Catholics worldwide. The Rosary is a form of vocal and mental prayer, on the Mysteries of our Redemption, divided into four groups of events with five mysteries in each group. The recitation of each decade is accompanied by meditation on one of the twenty events or "mysteries". The mysteries are divided into four groups: The Joyful Mysteries, The Sorrowful Mysteries, The Glorious Mysteries and the Luminous Mysteries.

It is an excellent method to exercise the spiritual practice of discipline. Many devoted Rosary followers will kneel during the entire Rosary. The Rosary is not interrupted by cell phones or other distractions.

Praying the Rosary alone, offers a method of spiritual isolation or solitude. Concentrating on the mysteries and the repetition of the prayers, can cause the outside world to drift away. It offers the feeling of closeness to Jesus and His Blessed Mother, Mary. Are there reasons to pray the Rosary daily? It offers a template to follow, that can enhance discipline and allow you to establish a deeper relationship with God.
