Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's reading from Matthew's Gospel comes after a discourse in which Jesus reproaches people who have witnessed His mighty deeds yet still lack belief. In this context, today's Gospel explains the reason for this unbelief and reveals what is necessary for faith.

This Gospel begins with Jesus' shout of joy, not on account of the socalled "wise and learned" who do not recognize His true identity, but for the "little ones" with humble and open hearts who 'get it.' A 'know-itall' attitude is a huge block hindering us from receiving God's selfrevelation. Jesus speaks about the special and unique relationship that exists between Him and His Father. It is really a statement about the divinity of Christ. In Jesus we find the Wisdom of God. He reveals the mind and heart of God to us.

The reading ends with Jesus' beautiful invitation to the "heavy burdened" to come to Him. The Pharisees and scribes have made the Law of Moses a heavy burden by adding to it a multitude of legalisms. On another level, faith in Christ helps all of us to deal with the burdens of life.

Family Connection

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches an important lesson for families: from the youngest and simplest among us we can learn the most profound insights about God. Parents who are attentive to this reality can learn much from their children even as their children are learning from them. Families who create time and space for encounters with God will enrich the faith of all who share in family life.

Gather as a family and read together today's Gospel, Matthew 11:25-30. Allow time for each person to reflect on what Jesus reveals to us about God. Invite each person to show these things in a creative way, perhaps through a picture, poem, or some other means. Share these with one another. Conclude in prayer together, thanking Jesus for making God known to us. Pray together the Lord's Prayer...

Come! The doors are open! Welcome Home!

If you haven't already come to Mass, you will notice there a few changes from the usual way in which we celebrate the Eucharist. In order for us to open the doors, we are required to follow the guidelines of the government, health authorities and the Diocese of Hamilton, established to provide for the well-being and safety of all.

For your convenience, we are including the guidelines, once again. When you come to Mass or at any time you may come to the church, for the foreseeable future, you will be asked to adhere to the following guidelines:



• If you have travelled outside Canada within the past 14 days, you are not to enter the church until you have completed the period of self-isolation.

• You are strongly encouraged to wear a mask upon entering the church.

- Everyone is to use the hand sanitizer provided upon entry to the church.
- Maintain a two-metre (six foot) distance at all times in the church and on church property.
- Only 30% of the seating capacity is permitted by government regulations at this time. Ushers will guide you to the available designated seats.

During the celebration of Mass, you will notice a few changes based on the recommendations of health authorities:



- The entrance procession will be simplified.
- There will be no hymnals in the pews; singing will be led by an instrumentalist and cantor only.
- Only one lector will proclaim the readings before the Gospel, and the petitions.
- There will be no collection and presentation of bread and wine at the usual time. You will be invited to deposit your offering in the basket/receptacle as you leave the church.
- Before Communion, following the prayer (*Lord, I am not worthy...*) the Priest will say once: *The Body of Christ.* All will respond together: *Amen.* Communion will be received in silence.



 You will be directed by the ushers to come to Communion row by row, while maintaining physical distancing. Particular directions will be given before Communion.

Communion can be received only in the hand at this time. Carefully extend your hands, placing one upon the other to receive the Body of Christ. Communion from the chalice is not permitted.

- Following the dismissal, you will be directed to leave the church, row by row, in order to maintain physical distancing. No printed bulletins will be available.
- You are asked to refrain from socializing with others following Mass.


Renovation & Repairs Projects

PARISH OFFICE OPENING!

We are all so happy that the Parish Office is opening July 6, 2020!

Office hours are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, 9 a.m. -12 p.m. and 1 p.m. -3 p.m. The Office is closed on Wednesdays.

Admittance to the Parish Office is by appointment only.

2. If you feel unwell or your temperature is elevated, please do not enter the office.

3. All visitors must provide contact information and attest that they are not exhibiting any signs of COVID-19 and have not been in contact with a COVID-19 patient over the last fourteen days.

4. Be sure to use hand sanitizer upon entering the office.

5. Be sure to maintain a physical distance of 2 metres (6 feet) at all times.

6. Please wear a protective mask when you come, if you forget we will have a complementary one for you.

The above guidelines are for those who have appointments. If you are dropping off something for the Parish, please place item through the mail slot in the wooden door behind the white storm/screen door (please feel free to wave – it will be great to see you!). If you are requesting a Mass or for any other inquiries, please call the Parish Office. Any requests for Mass Cards, will be placed in the outside mailbox for pick up, as we have been doing during this time of pandemic.

At this time, we are not able to provide the social distancing required within the Office itself and consequently to ensure the safety of all, should you arrive at the Parish Office, and wish to speak with us, we will need to communicate through the outside storm/screen door. We apologize for any inconvenience, but trust you will understand that our priority is to keep everyone safe!
