18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Jesus took the loaves – we read in today's Gospel - and raised His eyes to heaven, pronounced the blessing and handed them to the disciples to distribute to the people" (Mt 14: 19). These words are familiar to us. They are those of the Eucharist. The evangelist takes them to make the Christians of his communities understand that, after having assimilated the bread of the Gospel which is given to them through the preaching of the apostles, they must also approach the Eucharistic banquet to be filled. Five thousand men are fed. It is the number that symbolizes Israel. Twelve indicates the new community, constituted by the twelve apostles around Christ. Through His disciples - to whom He delivered His bread - Jesus Himself is the one who continues to feed the people of all times and places.

READ: The crowds continue to follow Jesus as He heals and teaches them. Here He feeds them, prefiguring the feeding in the Eucharist.

REFLECT: People need to be fed with truth as well as with bread. What was the miracle: the multiplication of some loaves or fishes or the following of the teachings of Jesus by sharing with others? Can the Eucharist exist outside the celebration of Mass?

PRAY: When praying at the Eucharist, the believer makes a commitment to live the Eucharist outside of Mass. Praying with the priest and the community finds completion in living out of the teaching of Jesus.

ACT: Pay attention to the eucharistic moments with family and friends outside of Mass.

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the Gospel passage (Mt 14:22-33), the disciples, nourished with the bread offered by Jesus now receive the order to get moving, to get into the boat to the other side. The second part of the passage (vv. 28-33) contains the dialogue between Jesus and Peter. It starts with the request of the apostle: "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water". As long as he keeps his eyes fixed on the Master, he is able to go to Him. When his faith diminishes, when he begins to doubt the choice he made, he sinks and is afraid of being overwhelmed, of losing his life.

READ: Jesus reaches out to the disciples in trouble, walking up to them on the water. Those in the boat bowed down before Jesus saying, "Truly, You are the Son of God."

REFLECT: Jesus asks Peter, "Why did you doubt?" Jesus challenges the sudden loss of faith, of Peter, in the midst of turbulence. What would God be asking us when we meet Him face- to-face?

PRAY: Let us ask God to probe our innermost being and lead us to conversion.

ACT: Today is a good day to make a confession of faith regarding who Jesus is for me. I will take some time and proclaim with my whole being that Jesus is my Lord and Savior.

Welcome Home!



If you haven't already come to Mass, you will notice there a few changes from the usual way in which we celebrate the Eucharist. In order for us to open the doors, we are required to follow the guidelines of the government, health authorities and the Diocese of Hamilton, established to provide for the well-being and safety of all.

For your convenience, we are including the guidelines, once again. When you come to Mass or at any time you may come to the church, for the foreseeable future, you will be asked to adhere to the following guidelines:



- Entrance is not permitted to those who have an elevated temperature, or are suffering from cough, sputum production, shortness of breath, undue fatigue, loss of appetite, muscle aching, runny nose, chills involving shakes, loss of sense or taste or smell. If you are sick, you are kindly asked to stay home.
- ❖ If you have travelled outside Canada within the past 14 days, you are not to enter the church until you have completed the period of self-isolation.
- ❖ Effective July 13, 2020, the Regional Municipality of Waterloo passed By-Law (Number 20-036) requiring the wearing of face masks or protective shields in all public places in the region, including places of worship. As such, you will be required to wear a mask when coming to Mass or to the church.

- Everyone is to use the hand sanitizer provided upon entry to the church.
- ❖ Maintain a two-metre (six foot) distance at all times in the church and on church property.
- Only 30% of the seating capacity is permitted by government regulations at this time. Ushers will guide you to the available designated seats.

During the celebration of Mass, you will notice a few changes based on the recommendations of health authorities:

- * The entrance procession will be simplified.
- ❖ There will be no hymnals in the pews; singing will be led by an instrumentalist and cantor only.
- Only one lector will proclaim the readings before the Gospel, and the petitions.
- There will be no collection and presentation of bread and wine at the usual time. You will be invited to deposit your offering in the basket/receptacle as you leave the church.
- ❖ Before Communion, following the prayer (*Lord, I am not worthy...*) the Priest will say once: *The Body of Christ*. All will respond together: *Amen*. Communion will be received in silence.



- * You will be directed by the ushers to come to Communion row by row, while maintaining physical distancing. Particular directions will be given before Communion.
- Communion can be received only in the hand at this time. Carefully extend your hands, placing one upon the other to receive the Body of Christ. Communion from the chalice is not permitted.
- ❖ Following the dismissal, you will be directed to leave the church, row by row, in order to maintain physical distancing. No printed bulletins will be available.
- ❖ You are asked to refrain from socializing with others following Mass.

PARISH OFFICE IS OPEN

Office hours are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, 9 a.m. - 12 p.m. and 1 p.m. - 3 p.m. The Office is closed on Wednesdays.

Please help us keep everyone safe by adhering to the following guidelines:

- 1. Admittance to the Parish Office is by appointment only.

 Please call: 519-743-4525 or email: st.teresa@stteresakit.ca to book an appointment.
- 2. If you feel unwell or your temperature is elevated, please do not enter the office.
- 3. All visitors must provide contact information and attest that they are not exhibiting any signs of COVID-19 and have not been in contact with a COVID-19 patient over the last fourteen days.
- 4. Be sure to use hand sanitizer upon entering the office.
- 5. Be sure to maintain a physical distance of 2 metres (6 feet) at all times.
- 6. Please wear a protective mask when you come, if you forget we will have a complementary one for you.

The above guidelines are for those who have appointments. If you are dropping off something for the Parish, please place item through the mail slot in the wooden door behind the white storm/screen door (please feel free to wave – it will be great to see you!). If you are requesting a Mass or for any other inquiries, please call the Parish Office. Any requests for Mass Cards, will be placed in the outside mailbox for pick up, as we have been doing during this time of pandemic.

At this time, we are not able to provide the social distancing required within the Office itself and consequently to ensure the safety of all, should you arrive at the Parish Office, and wish to speak with us, we will need to communicate through the outside storm/screen door. We apologize for any inconvenience, but trust you will understand that our priority is to keep everyone safe!
