24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel reading (Matthew 18:21-35) Peter asks Jesus how many times one ought to extend forgiveness to another. Peter proposes a reasonable number of times, perhaps seven. Jesus replies by extending Peter's proposal by an enormous amount; not just seven times should one forgive, but 77 times. The parable of the unforgiving servant is Jesus' elaboration of his initial reply to Peter. Through the parable we come to understand the depths of God's mercy toward us and the results of our acceptance of God's forgiveness. The lesson is clear: If we hoard God's mercy while showing no mercy to others, we risk forfeiting the effects of God's mercy in our lives.

READ: In life and death, we belong to the Lord. Hence, grudge and wrath towards others shall not have a place in us. If God shows mercy to us, we are bound to show mercy to others, as the parable of the unforgiving servant says.

PRAY: Pray for the grace of humility to accept God's mercy and share the same with others. Remember those who have hurt us and need our forgiveness. Let us ask for the grace to be reconciled.

REFLECT: Why does the servant who was forgiven a huge debt get wrathful and unforgiving towards his servant who owed him very little? The truth is, being a recipient of mercy does not always evoke gratitude and humility, but sometimes results in shame and anger, especially when one is egoistic and feels lesser before the forgiving one. We can accept mercy only when we love and respect the one who shows mercy and feel a kinship with him. Then we are ready to share mercy with others and feel kinship with them as well.

ACT: Time heals but oftentimes we let opportunities pass us by. Reach out with love and compassion in heart, forgive someone who has wronged you.

God forgives sins so that joy, not sadness, can flourish once again in one's heart.

If you haven't already come to Mass, you will notice there are a few changes from the usual way in which we celebrate the Eucharist. In order for us to open the doors, we are required to follow the guidelines of the government, health authorities and the Diocese of Hamilton, established to provide for the well-being and safety of all. Effective July 13, 2020, the Regional Municipality of Waterloo passed By-Law (Number 20-036) requiring the wearing of face masks or protective shields in all public places in the region, including places of worship. As such, you will be required to wear a mask when coming to Mass or to the church.

Newly Ordained – Father Pawel Stankiewicz Coming to our Parish

Father Pawel Stankiewicz, a newly ordained priest, in the Diocese of Hamilton, will visit our Parish, and celebrate Mass, next weekend, **Saturday and Sunday, September 19 & 20, 2020.**

Father Pawel Stankiewicz was born to Polish immigrants, in Toronto, on January 23 1991. He is the second of four sons. The family moved to Guelph when Pawel was 7 years old. His parents kept a home that shined with faith in Christ. Evening prayers and Sunday Mass were always done together, as a family. In grade 11, Pawel felt called to join the Carthusian monks, in Vermont. During his years of undergrad, at the University of Toronto, Pawel discerned that God wanted him to be a diocesan priest. After completing a Bachelor of Science in 2013, he joined the Diocese of Hamilton as a seminarian. After seven years of priestly formation, Pawel was ordained a priest with three others on August 15, 2020. Also, options have been expanded on how and whether personal visits are conducted. Face-to-face meetings have been an important piece of the campaign, but safety is paramount, and a number of alternatives, such as phone calls, will be utilized so that every parishioner's situation is handled safely, sensitively and appropriately.

Q. Won't giving now make it harder for a lot of parishioners?

A. The campaign is founded on stewardship, our belief that we give back in gratitude a portion of what we've been given by God. Stewardship isn't just for the good times in life, when we can give easily; it's for all times, including the bad. We may adjust how much we give, or to whom we give, but we continue to give – in gratitude for and in proportion to what we've been given. A truly sacrificial gift demonstrates our trust that God will provide what we need, though not necessarily what we want. Stewardship isn't what KEEPS us from getting through life: it's HELPS the tough parts of what us through them. get
