26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The parable of today's Gospel (Mt 21:28-32) depicts three characters: a father and two sons.

Jesus' hearers sensed immediately that the father represents God, but they are surprised by the fact that he has two sons. The Son of God is only one, Israel; through the prophet Hosea, the Lord said: "Out of Egypt I called my son" (Hos 11:1) and to the Pharaoh, he said: "Israel is my firstborn son" (Ex 4:22). To hear about the two sons of God is disconcerting for an Israelite, but it is only the beginning, the continuation of the parable is even more provocative.

At the invitation of his father to go to work in the vineyard, the firstborn zealously and readily answered: Yes, but then he did not go. He simply changed his mind to 'no', even when he had said 'yes'; he was not at all in accord with the program of his father. He had only spoken empty words.

The provocations of the parable are not over. The father turned to the second son the request to go to work in the vineyard and the answer was: "I don't want to." But then, overcame with remorse, he went (v. 30).

The conclusion of the parable (vv. 31b-32) contains what is perhaps the most provocative statement of Jesus: "The tax collectors and the prostitutes are ahead of you in the Kingdom of God." The verb is in the present; it is a fact: the public sinners who have no religious screen to hide themselves, those who cannot pretend because their condition is obvious to everyone, even to themselves, are at an advantage compared to those who consider themselves righteous.

Lip service of God will not merit heaven. Nominal Christians are not working in the Lord's vineyard.

Taking it Home:

How have you responded to God's invitation to work in His vineyard? Jesus died for us so we can live for Him. Do your actions reflect the life of a worker in His kingdom? Reflect on how you can better say "yes" to God's invitation. What do you need to repent of in order to better serve Him? God is merciful and is willing to forgive you and offer you a second chance. Even if you have been saying "no" to God, it's not to late to change that "no" to a "yes".

Welcome Home!

If you haven't already come to Mass, you will notice there are a few changes from the usual way in which we celebrate the Eucharist. In order for us to open the doors, we are required to follow the guidelines of the government, health authorities and the Diocese of Hamilton, established to provide for the well-being and safety of all. Effective July 13, 2020, the Regional Municipality of Waterloo passed By-Law (Number 20-036) requiring the wearing of face masks or protective shields in all public places in the region, including places of worship. As such, you will be required to wear a mask when coming to Mass or to the church.

Church is Open for Prayer – You are invited to visit Jesus, in the Most Blessed Sacrament, Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. The Adoration Chapel remains closed, but the church is open. Take advantage of this wonderful opportunity to come and spend some time with the Lord! Jesus is waiting for you!

Parish Records – During this time of pandemic, in hopes of communicating effectively with everyone, we have been reviewing our Parish Database and have discovered that our Parish Records could benefit from some up-dating. Special Collection — Several Special Collections were missed during the COVID-19 Shutdown.
