27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, Jesus once again speaks to the priests and elders with a parable. In this parable, the landowner leases his vineyard to tenants and sends his servants to collect the portion of the harvest that the tenants owe to him. Several times the servants are sent to collect payment, and each time they are beaten and killed by the tenants. Finally, the landowner sends his son to collect his rent. The tenants, believing that they will inherit the vineyard if the landowner dies without an heir, plot together and kill the landowner's son.

After telling the parable, Jesus questions the chief priests and elders about what the landowner will do to the wicked tenants. They all agree that the landowner will kill the wicked tenants and give the land to new tenants who will pay the rent. As a final attempt, he sends his son, but the workers in the vineyard hunt him out and kill him. They are convinced of being able to be masters of the field that has been entrusted to them.

All the details of the Gospel story have a symbolic meaning. The master is the Lord who has lavished so much care and expressed an immense love for His people (v. 33). The hedge is the Torah, the law that God has revealed to His people, to protect it from enemies, that is, from the proposals of senseless life that would lead it to ruin. The tenants are the chiefs, religious and political leaders, whose task is to place the people in ideal conditions to produce the fruits that the owner expects. The fruits are the works of love for the neighbor and social justice. The two groups of envoys are the prophets who, before and after the exile, were sent, always more numerous, to warn Israel to be faithful to the covenant. The time of harvest is the time of God's judgment that—this must be kept in mind—should not be understood as the "day of reckoning," but as an intervention of salvation.

The end result of the intervention of the master is the delivery of the vineyard to other workers who will make it produce fruits. This is not about the master's annoyed reaction, but his gesture of love and salvation. Not even the rejection and murder of his son can make him an enemy of humanity. The happy news which concludes the Gospel (v. 43) is that, despite all the refusals of people, in the end, God always finds the way to achieve His purpose and to obtain the good fruit He wants.

In Jesus' parable, He is addressing the chief priests and the elders of the people, in other words the "experts", the managers. To them in a particular way God entrusted His "dream", His people, for them to nurture, tend and protect from the animals of the field. This is the job of leaders: to nurture the vineyard with freedom, creativity and hard work.

Welcome Home!

If you haven't already come to Mass, you will notice there are a few changes from the usual way in which we celebrate the Eucharist. In order for us to open the doors, we are required to follow the guidelines of the government, health authorities and the Diocese of Hamilton, established to provide for the well-being and safety of all. Effective July 13, 2020, the Regional Municipality of Waterloo passed By-Law (Number 20-035) requiring the wearing of face masks or protective shields in all public places in the region, including places of worship. As such, you will be required to wear a mask when coming to Mass or to the church.

Church is Open for Prayer – You are invited to visit Jesus, in the Most Blessed Sacrament, Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. The Adoration Chapel remains closed, but the church is open. Take advantage of this wonderful opportunity to come and spend some time with the Lord! Jesus is waiting for you!

Parish Records – During this time of pandemic, in hopes of communicating effectively with everyone, we have been reviewing our Parish Database and have discovered that our Parish Records could benefit from some up-dating. 
The relics of St. John Paul II & St. Faustina Kowalska will visit St. Teresa of Avila Parish October 9 - 16, 2020
