Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week's Gospel (Mt 25:14-30) speaks of how Jesus' disciples are to conduct themselves as they await the Kingdom of Heaven. In the preceding passages and in last week's Gospel, Jesus taught that there is no way to predict the coming of the Kingdom of Heaven. His disciples must, therefore, remain vigilant and ready to receive the Son of Man at any time.

Jesus' parable talks about Christian discipleship using economic metaphors. Before he leaves on a journey, the master entrusts to his servants a different number of talents, giving to each according to their abilities. A talent is a coin of great value. Upon the master's return, he finds that the first and second servants have doubled their money, and both are rewarded. The third servant, however, has only preserved what was given to him because he was afraid to lose the money. He has risked nothing; he did not even deposit the money in a bank to earn interest. This servant is punished by the master, and his talent is given to the one who brought the greatest return. Jesus did not intend to give a moral lesson on honesty and how to invest the money, but rather on the commitment in putting to good use the treasures that belong to everyone.

The master entrusts his possessions to the most trusted servants. He knows their abilities, attitudes, competences, and according to these, he establishes how much to assign to each. This gentleman is clearly Christ who, before leaving the world, handed over all His goods to His disciples. The master gives no indication on how to manage the talents, giving a sign of full confidence in the intelligence, insight, prudence of his servants and respect for their freedom. We define what these goods are. This is what Jesus has given to His Church: the Gospel, the message of salvation intended to transform the world and create a new humanity; His Spirit "who renews the face of the earth" (Ps 104:30), even Himself in the sacraments; and then His power to heal, to comfort, to forgive, and to reconcile with God.

This parable teaches that God's judgement will be based on the service we render to God and to one another in accordance with the gifts that God has given to us. **Our gifts, or talents, are given to us for the service of others.** If we fail to use these gifts, God's judgement on us will be severe. On the other hand, if we make use of these gifts in service to the Kingdom of Heaven, we will be rewarded and entrusted with even more responsibilities. The central message of the parable is in the master's rebuke of the slothful servant: **the only unacceptable attitude is the disengagement; it is the fear of risk.** Even to the first two, perhaps not all the economic transactions went well. However, he is condemned because he let himself be blocked by fear.

This Gospel reminds us that Christian spirituality is not passive or inactive. Our life of prayer helps us to discern the gifts that have been given to us by God. This prayer and discernment ought to lead us to use our gifts in the service of God and our neighbor. God's grace allows us to share in the work of serving the Kingdom of Heaven.

READ: The parable of the talents reveals how a right attitude of the heart gets rewarded by the Lord. Those with the soundness of soul do not need to fear the advent of the Day of the Lord and His judgement. **PRAY:** Pray for the right attitude of the heart that makes us pleasing to the Lord. **ACT:** List out three talents God has given you. Plan out how well you can double them at the service of God and His people. **REFLECT:** One might wonder about the justice of unequal distribution of the talent among the servants. However, it is not what one receives that counts, but what one does with what he/she has received. The Master's delight and offer of reward are the same towards His servants who doubled their talents. **God looks not at the quantity of our offerings, but at their quality as well as the attitude with which we offer.**


