First Sunday of Lent

First Sunday of Lent

We have now entered the great season of Lent. For those of us who are old enough to remember, Lent in the past was not, in some respects, a time we looked forward to. Fasting and abstinence, not to mention other forms of penance, were in force and it was a serious business. Easter was looked forward to with real anticipation. Our attitudes toward Lent tended to be on the gloomy and negative side. Perhaps nowadays we have gone to the other extreme where Lent hardly means anything at all. "You mean Lent has started already? Really, I had no idea! Easter will be on top of us before we know where we are and I haven't bought a thing!"

The gospel of today's (Mk 1:12-15) Mass features the temptations of Jesus in the desert. It clearly links with the Lenten themes of fasting, penance and reconciliation with God and with our brothers and sisters. Note that Jesus is led into the desert by the Spirit of God. **The purpose clearly is not to lead Him to do evil but as a testing of His fitness for His coming mission.** Will He fail like our First Parents or like the Israelites of old? Or will he prove Himself worthy of the mission He has been given?

The Gospels of Matthew and Luke explain that Jesus fasted while in the desert, that Satan presented Him with three temptations, and that Jesus refused each one, quoting Scripture.

The fact that Jesus spent 40 days in the desert is significant. This recalls the 40 years that the Israelites wandered in the desert after being led from slavery in Egypt. The prophet Elijah also journeyed in the desert for 40 days and nights, making his way to Horeb, the mountain of God, where he was also attended to by an angel of the Lord. Remembering the significance of these events, we also set aside 40 days for the season of Lent.

Lent Exercises!

Please join us for different spiritual exercises at our parish: **Dedicate** ONE HOUR or half an hour for prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament. **Participate** in Stations of the Cross each Friday - 7:00 p.m. **Read** each day a short passage from the Bible. Choosing one of these commitments will help you to have a deep, powerful and unforgettable Lent! **It's not** what you give up... It's what you want to give!

Office hours are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, 9 a.m. -12 p.m. and 1 p.m. -3 p.m. The Office is closed on Wednesdays.

Please help us keep everyone safe by adhering to the following guidelines:

1. Admittance to the Parish Office is by appointment only. Please call: 519-743-4525 or email: <u>st.teresa@stteresakit.ca</u> to book an appointment.

2. If you feel unwell or your temperature is elevated, please do not enter the office.

3. All visitors must provide contact information and attest that they are not exhibiting any signs of COVID-19 and have not been in contact with a COVID-19 patient over the last fourteen days.

4. Be sure to use hand sanitizer upon entering the office.

5. Be sure to maintain a physical distance of 2 metres (6 feet) at all times.

6. You are required to wear a protective mask when you come, if you forget we will have a complementary one for you.

The above guidelines are for those who have appointments. If you are dropping off something for the Parish, please place item through the mail slot in the wooden door behind the white storm/screen door (please feel free to wave – it will be great to see you!). If you are requesting a Mass or for any other inquiries, please call the Parish Office. Any requests for Mass Cards, will be placed in the outside mailbox for pick up, as we have been doing during this time of pandemic.

At this time, we are not able to provide the social distancing required within the Office itself and consequently to ensure the safety of all, should you arrive at the Parish Office, and wish to speak with us, we will need to communicate through the outside storm/screen door.
