The Ascension of the Lord

Today's Gospel is taken from the conclusion of the Gospel of Mark, which tells us that, with His return to the Father, Jesus completes His mission on earth. But just before His Ascension, Jesus entrusted to the disciples the mission of preaching the Good News and evangelizing the whole world by bearing witness to Him through their lives.

"Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation." Mk 16, 15

At the end of His earthly life Jesus ascends triumphantly into heaven. The Church acclaims Him in His holy humanity, invited to sit on the Father's right hand and to share His glory. But Christ's Ascension is the pledge of our own. Filled with an immense hope, the Church looks up towards her leader, who precedes her into the heavenly home and takes her with Him in His own person: *''for the Son of God, after incorporating in Himself those whom the devil's jealousy had banished from the earthly paradise, ascends again to His Father and takes them with Him'' (St. Leo).*

Today's feast—the Ascension of our Lord in His human nature—to His Father's and our Father's home, is the confirmation and the guarantee of this doctrine of our faith. We shall all rise from the grave with new, glorified bodies and ascend to heaven, as Christ did. There we'll begin our true life of eternal happiness.

What all human beings want is to live on forever with our dear ones. Death breaks that continuity but only for a little while. That break is necessary for the new life to begin. It is only in heaven that this natural desire of an unending life with all those we love can be realized and death on earth is the door to that eternal life.



Crowning of Mary

The month of May is traditionally dedicated to our Blessed Mother, so we are encouraged to honour her in more significant ways all throughout this month. However, if you've found yourself overwhelmed by life and suddenly realize that we're more than halfway through May, yet you still haven't been doing much to honour Mama Mary (as many Filipino Catholics like to call her), you'll probably want to try being more intentional about it. So, to help you honour Mother Mary in a more significant way during the remaining days of May, here are a few simple suggestions:

1. Pray more Marian prayers.

If your family doesn't pray the Rosary daily, you can start with that, or maybe even just a decade a day. Or even just add, "Mother Mary, pray for us" after you say Grace before meals. **The key is to include our Mother in our daily prayers in a more significant way**.

2. Read books about Mother Mary.

There are lots of Marian-themed books around that are suitable for adults and children too. If you already have storybooks about Mother Mary in your home library, take them out and read them to your kids. If you have older children, you should still read to them, but also encourage them to do some reading on their own. Of course, if you don't have any books about Mary, you can always use your Bible and read stories about the Blessed Virgin Mary.



Mary is considered as the Queen of All Saints, and the Queen of Heaven and Earth, so holding a simple crowning ceremony for her would be a great way to honour her.

4. Watch videos or shows about Mother Mary.

There are many films featuring Mother Mary that you might want to consider watching with your kids. A few recommended titles are "Mary of Nazareth," "The 13th Day" (about the apparition of Our Lady of Fatima), and "Jean Delannoy's Bernadette" (about the apparition of Our Lady of Lourdes). Children will also enjoy watching animated shows that have Mother Mary in them, like CCC of America's "The Day the Sun Danced: The True Story of Fatima," "Juan Diego: Messenger of Guadalupe" and "Bernadette: The Princess of Lourdes." If you have a limited budget, you can also try searching YouTube for videos about Mother Mary.

5. Have Mary-themed arts and crafts activities - You can try searching online for easy Marian crafts for kids. Start with the resources here at <u>https://www.catholicmom.com/articles/mother-mary-and-the-may-crowning</u>
