

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today we continue to read from the Gospel of Mark (Mk 9:38-43,45,47-48). The evangelist, deals with two issues in the Gospel account this Sunday. Immediately, one could identify them: **envy and scandal**. Apparently, they have no close relation. The disciples learned that there were exorcists who were not members of the group, but they were equally effective in driving out demons invoking the name of Jesus. They tried to stop them, most probably due to envy. And the second point is scandal, that is, any wrongdoing, which leads others to sin.

"If any of you put a stumbling block before one of these little ones who believe in me, it would be better for you if a great millstone were hung around your neck and you were thrown into the sea." Mk 9, 42



The real followers of Jesus, the true and genuine members of His flock are those who are like little children – the "greatest" in His kingdom. Jesus protects them with such fervor, knowing how weak and vulnerable they are to the attacks of the devil. So He was very strong and fierce in His warning against scandal: Do not touch them, do not lead them to sin. For anyone who leads them to sin, "it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea".



First Reconciliation & First Holy Communion Confirmation Registration Meetings

Registration forms have been sent home with Grade 2/3 students and Grade 7/8 students at St. Teresa School and we wish to remind parents and candidates of their upcoming meetings. The meeting for **First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion** takes place this Sunday, **September 26, 2021** following the 10 a.m. Mass. The meeting for **Confirmation** will take place **October 3, 2021** following the 10 a.m. Mass. These are mandatory meetings and we ask that you bring the completed registration forms to the meeting. If your child does not attend St. Teresa School and you wish them to receive either of these sacraments, please call the parish office.

Parish Security and Keys – Just a reminder that as of July 28, 2021, following diocesan policy, the locks to the church, parish hall and rectory have been changed. Parish groups wishing to use our facility will need to pick up a key from the parish office and return it to the office following the meeting. Please do not hesitate to contact the parish office, with questions or for more information.

Masks and Safety Protocols – Responding to the needs and concerns of parishioners and following the instructions from the diocese, we have decided to assign the first pew on the left side of the church for those, who for medical reasons, are unable to wear masks. We encourage all parishioners to follow the protocols so that everyone feels welcome and safe at our church.

Special Collection – The special collection for The Needs of the Canadian Church, takes place this weekend, Sept. 25/26, 2021, as well. This annual charitable initiative assists the Bishops in their ministry of accompanying, teaching, guiding, sanctifying and caring for the Church in Canada. We appreciate any commitments that you are able to make.

National Day for Truth & Reconciliation – In June, the federal government passed new legislation making September 30th a national statutory holiday commemorating National Day for Peace and Reconciliation. National Day for Truth and Reconciliation commemorates the history and ongoing trauma caused by residential schools and is intended to honour the survivors, families and communities who continue to grieve for those who were lost. At the direction of His Excellency, Bishop Douglas Crosby, OMI, every Parish in the Diocese of Hamilton is to celebrate Mass on this day for the intentions of peace and reconciliation. Mass will be celebrated for this intention at 8:30 a.m. At the request of our diocese, the parish office will be closed.

COVID Vaccines

The official position of the Catholic Church is that all available COVID vaccines are ethical and all Catholics who are able are encouraged to receive the vaccine. All employees serving in the Diocese of Hamilton are encouraged to be fully vaccinated or to submit to a COVID rapid test every Monday and Thursday in order to carry out their responsibilities. Volunteer liturgical ministers are required to be fully vaccinated. Bishop Douglas Crosby, OMI, encourages every member of the Catholic Church within our Diocese of Hamilton to be fully vaccinated.
