We continue to look at the experience the disciples had of the Risen Jesus. The Gospel (J 21: 1-19) speaks of recognising the presence of God and of Jesus in our daily life and calls us to witness to our faith with consistency and courage. It is early morning. They are all tired and disappointed. After a whole night's fishing, they had caught absolutely nothing. They had forgotten the words of Jesus:

"Without me, you can do nothing."

Suddenly, a stranger on the shore, a shadowy outline in the morning's half-light, begins a dialogue. "Have you caught anything?" Reluctantly the fishermen (you know what fishermen are like!) admit they have got nothing. **"Cast your net on the right side of the boat and you'll find some"** they are told. They did so and they were overwhelmed. There were so many fish that they simply could not be taken into the boat. When they come ashore, they find the stranger-Lord is preparing a meal for them of bread and roasted fish. "Bring some of the fish you have just caught." The fish "you" have caught? Yes, they had pulled them in but without the Lord they would never have found them. "Without me, you can do nothing."

There are all the elements of a Eucharist here. They are in the presence of Jesus, the Word of God, and listening to Him. "Come and have breakfast," not unlike "Take, all of you, and eat together." They and He are sharing what they have and eating in unity and community. Such a simple scene which is a beautiful picture of the Church.

"When you have received Holy Communion, close your bodily eyes so that you may open the eyes of your soul. Then look upon Jesus in the centre of your heart."

The March For Life 2022 Theme: I AM



"I AM" is a shout into the abyss that "I exist."

Debates about abortion are characterized by phrases like "women's rights" and "My Body, My Choice" — as if there wasn't another human involved and whose rights must be taken into account. The preborn are real. They have already entered into this world, even though they may be hidden from us most of the time—revealed only in brief snapshots through ultrasound technology.



"I AM" is a claim to existence—an assertion that says "I am here! Notice me!"

It is a challenge to those who are "pro-choice" to see the preborn, to recognize them. It is a challenge to those who are pro-life to remember for whom we fight, whose lives are at stake. It is a challenge to all of us to ask ourselves what other existences we might be overlooking—those of mothers in crisis pregnancies, the elderly, or disabled—and to respond by affirming their presence, their humanity.

"I AM" declares that existence is enough.



No human being should have to argue for his/her worth. It's not something that's earned. Our worth is inherent; it lies not in what we do, but in what we are: human. While we value what abilities we have been given, they are not the source of our value. Mistaking them as such is reductionist; that is, it reduces the incredible complexity and beauty of the human person into a simply calculation of what he or she can contribute to society."The late Dame Cicely Saunders, pioneer of modern hospice and palliative care, imparted: "You matter because you are you, and you matter to the end of your life. We will do all we can not only to help you die peacefully, but also to live until you die."



"I AM" demands a law to protect the preborn.

Our country does not grant the preborn any legal recognition. The Criminal Code of Canada defines a "human being" as a child who has "completely proceeded, in a living state, from the body of its mother." Planned Parenthood and other pro-abortion groups similarly wish to erase the preborn, referring to them simply as "the pregnancy." Pregnancy is a state of being, not a preborn human.



"I AM" is the name of God, shared with Moses when his people were in bondage.

3600 years later, the world finds itself in bondage again, through the scourge of abortion and euthanasia. Under the illusion of "freedom of choice," we have become slaves to sin. There is only one path through the "Red Sea" of the Culture of Death – and that is following the path of the Great "I AM," who is the Way, the Truth and the LIFE!
