Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The story in today's Gospel (Luke 16:19-31) may seem quite unfair. A successful man, indicated by the prosperity of his surroundings, is buried in hell. A sniveling beggar, who may have never done a day's work in his life, ends up in Abraham's bosom. Is this Christian teaching? To understand this story properly may involve a radical change in the way we – and the society we belong to – normally thinks. And, importantly for those who wish to be truly Christian, it will involve learning some of the values of Jesus, as described in the Gospel.

"The man who had been rich said, 'Then, father, I beg you to send Lazarus to my father's house — for I have five brothers — that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment."

The rich man made the excuse (when it was too late) that he did not realize what was going on. His brothers (also rich?) did not realize either. Let them be warned, he pleaded. Even in hell, the rich man could still only think of his own family and not of all the others to whom he was responsible. It would be no use warning them, Jesus said. They would not listen, even if someone rose from the dead. Ironic words indeed. Jesus has risen from the dead this 2,000-years and how many of us have taken in the message of the Gospel about wealth and poverty?

Family Connection

Talk with your children about some of the things that they have that can be shared with others. Ask your children to describe a time when they had to share something that they had. Ask if this was easy or difficult and why. Talk about some of the ways in which your family shares your possessions. Read together today's Gospel, Luke 16:19-31. Consider together some reasons why the rich man may not have shared his riches with the poor man, Lazarus. Identify some reasons why we might share our possessions with others. Make a commitment as a family to do something this week in which you will choose to share your possessions with someone in need.

Whoever has not begun the practice of prayer, I beg for the love of the Lord not to go without so great a good. There is nothing here to fear but only something to desire.
