## **Fourth Sunday of Advent**

We are now on the eve of the birth of Jesus. In today's Gospel, Matthew tells us how this came about. His account is totally different from that of Luke. The only thing in common with both accounts are the central ideas that:

- Jesus is conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, and
- Joseph and Mary are the parents of Jesus.

In both accounts there is an angelic appearance: in one case to Mary and in the other to Joseph. Mary is told – in Luke's gospel – that she is to bear a son. When she says that she is still a virgin, she is told that the Holy Spirit will come upon her and her child will be the Son of God. In Joseph's case, he is told – in Matthew's gospel – not to be afraid to take Mary home as his wife because the child with whom she is pregnant is from the Spirit of God. The stories are different but the central message is the same. Mary is the mother of the Child but Joseph is not the father. The child has been conceived by the power of God's Spirit. The son is to be called 'Jesus', which means 'Saviour' because His mission is to save His people from their estrangement with God.
