The Ascension of the Lord

(World Day for Social Communication)

Today's Gospel is taken from the conclusion of the Gospel of Matthew. Matthew's Gospel quickly moves from the disciples' discovery of Jesus' empty tomb, to Jesus' appearance to Mary Magdalene and the other Mary, to the commission that Jesus gives His disciples in today's Gospel. Here we are told that the eleven disciples go to the mountain in Galilee, as Jesus had instructed, through Mary Magdalene and the other Mary (cf. Matthew 28:9-10). They see Jesus, and both, worship and doubt, at the same time. Jesus approaches them and commissions them to baptize and teach, "to make disciples of all nations." The Gospel ends, as it had begun, with the promise that Jesus will continue to be Emmanuel, "God with us" (cf. Matthew 1:23), for all eternity.

The Ascension is not to be understood literally, as if Jesus floated up into space on His way to "heaven". Where is "heaven"? Is it above Jerusalem? Is it in the whole sky encircling the earth? Heaven should be conceived, not as a place, but as a relationship with God and God is everywhere, in the whole universe. Jesus did not have to 'go' anywhere to be with His Father. The Ascension is part of what we call the Paschal Mystery. There are four inter-related parts: suffering and death; resurrection; ascension; and the sending of the Spirit. They are closely interlocked as one reality. If the resurrection says that the crucified Jesus is alive, the Ascension says that the living Jesus has entered into glory, sharing on an equal level the glory of His Father.

Family Connection

Just as Jesus sent His disciples to make disciples; our family, the domestic Church, is called to bear witness to the life of discipleship. That act of witnessing can take many forms. First and foremost, our family should call people to discipleship, by the example of our love for one another. That example, is only the beginning - our love must extend beyond the family, reaching out to others and to the world. **Pray as a family for the grace to be witnesses to the world, of the life of discipleship. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.**

The Novena in honour of the Holy Spirit

This is the oldest of all novenas since it was first made at the direction of Our Lord Himself when He sent His apostles back to Jerusalem to await the coming of the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost. Addressed to the Third Person of the Holy Trinity, it is a powerful plea for the light and strength and love so sorely needed by every Christian. Join us starting - Friday, May 19th after Mass.
