Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

One day, near the city of Philippi, founded by one of the sons of Herod the Great, in the extreme north of the country, Jesus addresses two questions to the apostles. The first is simple enough: "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" The second is more challenging: "Who do you say I am?" It is at this point that Peter intervenes with the surprising answer. He speaks in the name of all and shows to have understood everything. He says to Him: "You are the Christ," you are Messiah, the Saviour of which the prophets spoke about and all our people are waiting for (v. 16). You are the one for whom we are willing to wager our life. Jesus commends Simon Peter for this profession of faith, indicating that this insight has come from God. Because of Simon Peter's response, Jesus calls him the "rock" upon which Jesus will build the Church. This is a word play on the name Peter, which is the Greek word for "rock." Peter is then given special authority by Jesus, a symbolic key to the Kingdom of Heaven.

Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel (Mt 16:21-27) continues the story that began in last week's Gospel. Simon Peter was called the "rock" upon which Jesus would build His Church, and yet Peter continues to show the limitations of his understanding of Jesus' identity. Now that the disciples have acknowledged that Jesus is the Messiah, Jesus confides in them the outcome of His ministry: He must suffer and die in Jerusalem to be raised on the third day. Peter rejects this prediction, and Jesus rebukes him severely, calling him "Satan." In opposing this aspect of Jesus' mission, Peter shows that he is no longer speaking based on the revelation from God, but as a human being. Jesus then teaches all of the disciples about the difficult path of discipleship: to be Christ's disciple is to follow in His way of the cross.

Christians know that this life is a period of training, which makes us ready hereafter to receive the eternal reward which Christ has won for us. Every trainee knows that one must endure certain hardships and sufferings in order to merit graduation into one's chosen profession or trade. On our Christian graduation day we shall, please God, hear the welcome words: "Well done good and faithful servant; because you have been faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater, come and join in your Master's happiness" (Mt. 25: 21). May God grant that every one of us will hear these words of welcome.

READ: You must discern the will of God: what is good, what pleases, what is perfect. **REFLECT:** God's will—what is good, perfect, pleasing. This is our life's aim. We need to discern it always to hit the mark. PRAY: We are aware of how we often miss the mark: our sins. Let us aim to do what's more positive so we would really be praising God. ACT: Ponder on the difference between being really discerning and merely discriminating.
